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The School of Nursing offers a two-year course of graduate study leading to the Master of Science in Nursing (M.S.N.) designed to prepare nurses with a bachelor's degree in nursing for advanced practice. The M.S.N. Advanced Practice/ Postlicensure program prepares nurse practitioners and clinical nurse specialists.



Admission Requirements

- B.S. degree in nursing from an accredited nursing program satisfactory to UCLA Graduate Division
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- TOEFL or IELTS Academic (International Applicants)
- Evidence of current licensure as a registered nurse in the State of California
