ADULT/GERONTOLOGY PRIMARY CARE NURSE PRACTITIONER
SAMPLE COURSE SEQUENCE – SUBJECT TO REVISION

A minimum of **78-79** units (18 classes) are required for the Adult/Gerontology Primary Care NP student. Each student must meet with their faculty advisor every quarter to review progress in the program and plan coursework for future quarters.

A minimum of 4 units of nursing theory elective coursework is required for this specialty. Nursing theory elective courses must be selected in consultation with the student's faculty advisor. A student may opt to take a 3-unit elective at the discretion of the advisor. A sample list of acceptable elective courses is provided below. Students may request to take an elective course in a related subject through another department on campus with the advisor's approval.
