Thank you for your interest in the UCLA School of Nursing. The Masters Entry Clinical Nurse (MECN) Program leads to a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree. This program is designed for individuals who have a baccalaureate degree in another discipline to prepare for a career in nursing. The MECN Program prepares nurse generalists with special leadership skills to function in acute care hospitals. Our students will focus on being providers and managers of care at the point of care; prepared to implement evidence-based practice and quality improvement in clinical settings. This is a two-year program.

In our program you will develop a strong theoretical base upon which to build your clinical, research, and leadership skills. Opportunities exist to collaborate with researchers and clinical experts in many departments. Our students participate in clinical practice at our practice partner sites: The New Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center, UCLA-Santa Monica Medical Center, Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, VA- West Los Angeles, and Saint John's Medical Center. Resources available to students enrolled in the School of Nursing include a computer laboratory with access to a mainframe computer and other up-to-date equipment to support graduate study. In addition, one of the nation's premier biomedical libraries with computer search services is located right next door in the Center for Health Sciences.

We accept applications for the Fall Quarter only and the deadline to apply for Fall 2023 is **November 1, 2022**. The Admissions application will be available in September at www.grad.ucla.edu.

Students are admitted for the fall quarter only. The Admissions application is available online at www.grad.ucla.edu. Please note that the deadline to submit your application is **November 1st**.

Items that you must submit as part of your online application:

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Please respond to the following. Your statement can be up to 500 words in length (approximately 1-page, single spaced, using 1-inch margins and 12-point font). You do not need to answer every question; focus on the elements that you feel are most relevant to your candidacy.

- What is your purpose in applying for graduate study in your specified degree program? Describe your area(s) of interest, including any subfield(s) or interdisciplinary interests.
- What experiences have prepared you for advanced study or research in this degree program? What relevant skills have you gained from these experiences? Have your experiences led to specific or tangible outcomes that would support your potential to contribute to this field (examples: performances, publications, presentations, awards or recognitions)?
- What additional information about your past experience may aid the selection committee in evaluating your preparation and aptitude for graduate study at UCLA?
- Why is the UCLA graduate program to which you are applying is the best place for you to pursue your academic goals? If you are applying for a research master's or doctoral program, we encourage you to indicate specific research interests and potential faculty mentors.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

This statement should not duplicate the Statement of Purpose. Please write the Personal Statement (approximately 1-page, single spaced, using 1-inch margins and 12-point font) describing how your background, accomplishments, and life experiences led to your decision to pursue the graduate degree for which you are applying. Include any educational, personal, cultural, economic, or social experiences, challenges or opportunities relevant to your academic journey. Describe any aspects of your personal background, accomplishments, or achievements that will allow the department to evaluate your contributions. Contributions to diversity, such as efforts to advance equitable access to education, public service that addresses the need of a diverse population.

RESUME/CV

Please upload your Resume or CV to the online application.

RECOMMENDATION FORMS

Three are required. **You do not need to send your recommenders the form.** Once you fill out their contact information in the online application, they will automatically be sent a link to complete the form.

TRANSCRIPTS

You are required to upload unofficial transcripts into the application. If admitted, you will need to send **one official** transcript from the school at which you completed your Bachelor's degree(s). We also require **one official** transcript from other schools at which you completed prerequisite classes.
