Notes:

- An individual student's program may differ depending on preparation on entry into the program. The advisor and student may petition for additional or alternative coursework as needed to achieve the PhD.
- Students with a baccalaureate degree on entry work with their advisor to select additional courses as needed beyond the *basic core* PhD required courses. This is determined by the student's baccalaureate transcript and RN experience. For example, if a student has little to no RN experience, they will add specialty nursing course(s) in year 1 and/or 2. Students without an advanced physiology course, or graduate level nursing research course, will add these courses to their PhD course of study year 1 or 2. Students without a graduate level course related to human diversity in health and illness would add N209 or a similar course. This may relocate core required courses as shown in Table 1 from year 1 to year 2 of the PhD program of study. WQE is then taken in summer of year 2.
- Written Qualifying Exam (WQE) is offered every summer quarter. Passing WQE must occur prior to 9th quarter of the PhD program.*
- Required basic core courses build upon each other and are requisite to the next course as sequenced in the tables above. For example, all winter and spring courses in Table 1 build upon N202 and N210A; N206A in winter sequences to N206B in spring, etc.
- N299B Nursing Research / Laboratory concurrent with N596 is taken once by students using qualitative methods for their dissertation and twice by students using quantitative methods for their dissertation.
- N205B satisfies requirement for one cognate when taken by students using quantitative methods for their dissertation.
- N596 may be taken any quarter, any year prior to advancement to candidacy.*
- Cognates: minimum of 3 courses outside of School of Nursing, can be taken any quarter, any year, but are a requirement for Advancement to Candidacy.*
- After advancement to candidacy, students enroll in N599 research hours.
- Students may take electives inside or outside of the School of Nursing at any time during their program of study.
- Students can earn an MS degree on the way to the PhD after completing 11 graduate-level courses, 44 units minimum, and passing the WQE. Of the 11 courses, 4 units can be 500-level.

Optional PhD Courses in the School of Nursing recommended but not required:

- N209 Human Diversity in Health and Illness 4 units is offered in winter or spring quarter.
- N295B Grant Writing II is offered in winter quarter 4 units, not required but highly recommended for those who plan to write grants. Grant Writing I is a requisite course.
- N299D Nursing Seminar (Teaching Theory) is offered fall quarter 2 units, not required but recommended for those who plan a career teaching.
- N495A Nursing Education Practicum is offered fall and winter quarters 2 units, not required for PhD Program but is required for all Teaching Assistants (TAs) at UCLA.
